



Recognizing the Anticipated Growth in Medicaid

Southern states anticipated that if they were to expand their S-CHIP programs, their outreach efforts would also result in a growth in Medicaid enrollment. SGA encouraged Congress to provide adequate additional resources to support reasonably anticipated Medicaid growth within S-CHIP reauthorization.

The Old S-CHIP Statute	The New S-CHIP Statute
Did nothing to address Medicaid growth as a result of S-CHIP outreach.	Provides states performance bonus funding if they implement various outreach and enrollment activities and those activities result in an increase in the number of Medicaid-enrolled children above the state's target level.
